Sports Premium Impact Statement 2016 - 2017

During the last year we saw continued success of the use of Sports Premium funding to subsidise our schools PE and sport curriculum, increasing opportunities for all children to engage in school sports. Extra-curricular sports have enabled pupils to participate in inter school competitions in sports such as cross country, football, tennis, kwik cricket, swimming, gymnastics, netball, multi-skills, and athletics. We have enjoyed particular success this year in football, netball, tag rugby, swimming, athletics and cross country. In house training has continued for play leaders to support lunchtime activities facilitated by lunchtime supervisors and teaching assistants. Funding has included a wider range of equipment to support the curriculum and competitive sports, such as a bag of throwing equipment, to complement our commitment to track and field, as well as new rugby balls and footballs to replace old stock.

Throughout the year Wedmore First School Academy have continued to participate in a wide variety of sports, and competed with a high degree of success in school games competitions. Our school remains unbeaten in competitive matches and tournaments for the second year in succession:

- Took part in Y4 inter school gymnastics festival

- Took part in Y4 multi-skills school games festival
- Took part in Y3 multi-skills school games festival

- Took part in coaching session provided by Wedmore Tennis club in association with LTA
- Regular Coaching sessions with Sophie Luff (Western Storm Cricket)
- One off cricket coaching session with Jos Buttler (England Cricket)
- First place for Year 4 in Cross Country
- Individual runners up medals for boys and girls in inter school cross country competition
- Winners of inter school Tag rugby competition

Intra school competition takes place during our Sports day during the summer term. Additional opportunities for children to not only participate in sport but organise games and competitions, give ownership of school sport amongst pupils. This is encouraged during PE and games sessions. Deployment of teaching assistants as play leaders at lunchtime has ensured access to equipment and activities provided. Additional football goals for the playground have been purchased and plans made to re-site the ball shooter have been made, when the playground is to be resurfaced.

Wedmore First School Academy is proud to compete with other Wessex Learning Trust (WLT) schools and plan fixtures, festivals and experiences accordingly. This degree of

cooperation ensures children mix together before transfer to the middle school (HSMS), and transition is made easier.

Membership of WLT Sports Partnership has ensured opportunities for children to compete in a comprehensive range of sports.

Links have been established with many sporting organisations, both local and national, so children can be signposted accordingly and to ensure specialist provision can be accessed.

Sports taken up by pupils include: show jumping, horse riding, fencing, rugby, football, cricket, tennis, swimming, gymnastics, street dancing, distance running, orienteering, canoeing, sailing, Tai Kwon Do, kick boxing, trampolining, hockey and parkour.

Our PE coordinator has attended meetings with representatives of partner schools on a regular basis, as well as attending the annual sports coordinators conference held in Bridgwater.

We also wish to take the opportunity to thank the parents and carers involved in the school PTA, who do such a terrific job in maintaining and operating the school swimming pool. A new cover has been fitted, other various parts replaced and despite the mixed weather this year, we saw an increased take up in swimming lessons on site.

2017-18 sees an increase in the sports premium funding allocation. As part of a multi-academy trust WFSA will see its budget double, so we are looking to increase our sporting provision accordingly.

Impact:

The Sport Premium Funding will impact upon our school in the following ways:

- ✓ Greatly enhance the skills of our staff team (teaching and non-teaching) in terms of their ability to deliver, or support in, very high quality PE sessions for our children;
- ✓ Provide a high level of challenge in this area of the curriculum for our children;
- ✓ Raise the skill level and confidence in children to participate in PE and various sporting opportunities;
- ✓ Increase children's knowledge of the role that PE and sport can play as part of a healthy lifestyle;
- ✓ Enable children to take part in a greater range of PE/sporting activity and broaden horizons as to what is possible;
- ✓ Raise the profile of PE and Sport across the whole school community to help to make developments sustainable for the future;
- ✓ Allow us to continue to make links with outside sporting providers and club links.
