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Dear families

It's already December and the Christmas tree is up! This term has flown by, we are now on a countdown to Christmas (10 more get ups!)

Thank you to parents who took the time to fill in a questionnaire at parents evening, I've had a look through them all. There are definite themes within the responses, I am pleased that so many parents are happy with what we do here. In terms of areas for development, we had feedback from some parents asking for spellings to be sent home. As part of our phonics scheme, children learn and apply their learning of the sounds in words in their reading and writing every day. Some children who need it also have extra support several times a week to ensure they are secure in their understanding, which is also great, but the scheme does not recommend sending home spellings. We are very happy with the phonics scheme we now have in place and the results are very good but we also feel that it would be even better if we could supplement it with a spelling programme. Mrs Tratt, our phonics lead, has identified a programme which would run alongside our phonics scheme and we are looking to launch this in the New Year. Watch this space! There was a question aimed at parents of children with SEND, asking if they felt the right support was in place. Many people ticked the "No" box, this is likely to be because the parents responding don't have children with SEND (the number of questionnaires supports this.) If you have any concerns about your child's learning or support, please don't hesitate to speak to your child's teacher or myself. We are here to listen and are keen to ensure we work together for the best possible outcomes.

This Week in . . .

Duck Class:

In Duck Class this week we have been talking about our teeth. We have had lots of activities out, but the most popular has been our toy teeth with brushes and toothpaste to make them all clean. We have been talking about how to keep our teeth strong and healthy and have enjoyed our Pepper pig goes to the dentist story.

We have also been getting in the Christmas spirit with decorations, nativity practice and the boogie beat party. Carrie brought along Rudolf to sing songs, read a story about the growing Christmas tree, and even had flying snowballs on the parachute. Only 2 weeks to go until the Christmas break so look out for more Christmas things from us!

Robin Class:

This week in Robin Class we have been busy learning about different ways of representing a number from 2 - 5, we have used cubes, stickers and painting blocks to show all the different patterns we know. We are becoming super readers learning lots of common exception words and new digraphs which we are independently using in our play. Not long to go until our nativity play so we are also busy practising and singing during any spare moment. Finally we have learnt about St Andrew the patron saint of Scotland, learning that he was a fisher man, they wear kilts and we have made some yummy shortbread too.



Deer Class:

The children have been getting their final prep ready for our Nativity performance next week! Positions have been learnt and songs are being perfected and we can't wait for you all to see! Despite the cold weather, the children had a great PE lesson this week. We focused on our team work and catching skills. We challenged ourselves to see how many claps we could do whilst the ball was in the air! In Maths, the children have been learning about writing expressions. We have discussed how we can write an addition expression in more than one way as we still get the same 'whole' answer! Keep up the great work Deers!

Rabbit Class:

Rabbit Class have been busy painting and decorating gift tags to sell at the Christmas fair. They look great sop please come and buy some to label your Christmas gifts! The nativity is going well and the children have made me so proud learning their lines. Please continue to practice these over the weekend as our dress rehearsal is on Monday. In maths the children have been adding multiples of 10 to two-digit numbers using their knowledge of numbers and place value. In English, the children have been innovating the story of Little Red Riding Hood. They have had some excellent ideas for settings, characters and villains!!

Fox Class:

Fox class have had another lovely week! The children have also been working really hard in their phonics this week and have been keen to participate in these lessons. In maths we have also been working on adding a multiple of ten to a two-digit number, some of us have found this a bit tricky this week but they showed some amazing resilience and were able to find the answers eventually!

We have also been practising really hard for our Nativity which is next week, we hope you'll love it as much as we do (the children are so excited!!). Not only this, but we have also started to prepare for the Christmas Fair which is on Friday the 8th of December; the children have been getting very crafty and have been making things to sell at the fair! Christmas is nearly here!

Hedgehog:

This week Hedgehog class have written AMAZING river shape poems full of the most fantastic descriptions! We are very proud of their hard work and can't wait to publish them! In science, we looked at lots of different types of rocks and planned and carried out an investigation to find out which were permeable (let water in). We all found that chalk was the least permeable rock as it absorbed the most drops of water. We found that marble and granite were the least permeable.

Owl:

This week has been filled with fun for Owl class. We have been busy in English, 2010

creating our own worlds behind a portal and have been planning our own portal story. As part of our electricity topic in science, we created circuits to test what is an electrical conductor and what is an insulator. Finally, we now have a special visitor in Owl class called Buddy the Elf who will be Santa's special helper throughout December!
