Dear Parents

We had an inspiring Inset day focusing on inclusion and wellbeing, it was great to start off the term thinking about how we can maintain well being but also continue to make improvements to school life. Being inclusive is one of our values, we often talk to the children about making sure that everyone has a friend to play with and feels included. Reminders are still needed from time to time, we all need to make sure we are being kind to each other at school too. In every class, there is a help card or mechanism of asking an adult to talk — we also remind children to use this if they're feeling bothered by something or need help sorting out a situation they're unhappy about.

This year, we'll be starting to redesign our wider curriculum to make it more bespoke for our school – thinking about how we teach about diversity and inclusivity as part of this will be a challenge in a setting which doesn't have a cultural mix. I speak for the staff team when I say we are excited about this prospect and keen to make this a thread which runs throughout.



This Week in . . .

Duck Class:

Welcome back to all our children who are term time only. We had a lovely week during the holidays and made the most of the empty field and playground and visited every day. This week we have moved onto our new topic, transport. Our book this week is 'dig digging' and introduces lots of machinery. We have been learning to negotiate space and obstacles in our gym sessions and making obstacle courses outside. We have also looked at the number 3 and recognising our names.

This week in English we have started to learn about persuasive writing. We will be looking at the content from a range of Persian texts in preparation for writing our own. Fox class have had a lovely first week back. We have started some new learning in English; we will be looking at writing our own persuasive leaflets to convince people to come and visit our castles. So far, we have looked at imperative verbs as well as different sentence types. They have done some amazing writing so far! We have also been doing some art this week which is based around Spring. The children have been working on their shading skills, which they then had to use to draw a daffodil and then shade it using their pencils.

This week Hedgehogs have been amazing at swimming again! Their skills and confidence are increasing so much, it's wonderful to see! In maths we have been looking at 2D shapes and in particular, focusing on finding right angles which they have been brilliant at!
