Dear families, it will soon be the summer term (hopefully the warm weather will return!). In preparation for summer dress season, I have made a few small changes to our uniform policy. What a busy week we have had! We have used a range of junk modelling to create boats, experimenting whether we can make them float or sink and which materials are the best to use. We have also compared vehicles from the past and present, discussing the similarities and differences. In our maths we have continued our learning on doubles, but also learnt about odd and even numbers and how we can know the difference.

Deer Class

Deer Class have had a lovely week of learning! In Science, we have been exploring transparent and opaque materials and discovering the exciting signs of spring around us. In English, we have started learning about recounts by drawing pictures from our trip to the Clifton Suspension Bridge and practising using time connectives to talk about what happened. Rabbit Class

Rabbit Class have been busy scientists this week! We explored what plants need to grow by carrying out our own cress experiment. The children tested different conditions, including light, water, and warmth, and carefully observed what happened. They discovered that plants grow best when they have the right balance of these things. We were very impressed with their thoughtful observations and the conclusions they made from their investigations! We were also very excited to see that our bean plants have started to shoot.

Squirrel Class

What a wonderful week the Squirrels have had! It was such a pleasure for us all to be able to share the hard work that the children have been putting into their Showcase work and performances and we are so proud of everything that they have created! Beyond the Showcase, we have also been embarking on a creative writing task inspired by our reading of *Charlie and the Chocolate Factory* in English and continuing to embed our understanding of column subtraction in Maths - so we are probably feeling about ready for a little Easter break soon...!

Owl Class

This week, Owls have had a fantastic time learning about the legacy of the Anglo-Saxons and Vikings in Britain, using a range of primary and secondary sources. We also explored fact files and discussed the difference between fact and opinion, sharing some fun examples along the way! To finish the week, we enjoyed getting hands-on in D.T. by making our very own Anglo-Saxon bread.

Wondering how to get your child talking about what they're reading?

Try these 3 simple questions.....

Sometimes "Did you enjoy your book?" doesn't lead to much conversation. Instead, try asking:

- *Which part was your favourite?*
- *Did anything surprise you?*
- *Which character would you be, and why?*

These simple questions help to develop children's comprehension by encouraging them to think more deeply about what they have read.
